

Humanity could not resolve its most basic health crises until understanding the structure of the human body, and the nature of disease threatening it. We lack a similar understanding of the structure and nature of our global economy, jeopardizing our daily needs while threatening the vital ecosystems on which we rely. Stemming from three decades of work in ecology, economics, and business, Giordanengo sheds new light on the shared structure of ecosystems and economies. From his deep knowledge of restoration, Giordanengo paints clear pictures not only of a sustainable economic structure, but the path to restoring our global economy to a resilient and productive state. If you have not explored ecosystems for clues to the inner workings of our economies, this talk will challenge you to look, and to look again.

- Impacts of energy and trade on economic diversity.
